placed under the previsions of Section 4894, Revised Statutes, as amended, U.S.C., title 35, section 37, and it is desired that the application be continued under the provisions of said section for a further period of three years, bearing in mind that the three year period will expire in the present case on June 24, 1939. Reference is made in this connection to the formal notification of March 29, 1939.

In conformity with the requirements of Section 4894, there is fired herewith a letter from the Secretary of Far dated April 24, 1989, requesting that the application be continued under the three year rule.

Reference is made by way of response to the official communication of June 24, 1966. It is noted that division has been required in this case. It is requested that the requirement for division be waited for reasons hereinefter set forth:

This application has been filed under the Act of 1885, as smended, April 50, 1988, and apart from the fact that the transfer of title to the Government was made when invoking pectical 4894, the case has the

usual status under the Ne-Fee Act. The application has been prepared at Government expense and, following the customary procedure, no fees are paid to the Patent Office in such cases. If divisional applications should be required, the Covernment would be put to additional expense and an additional burden would be placed on the Patent Office for any divisional application or applications which might be filed and without compensation therefor. Moreover, the War Department would be put to additional expense insident to the preparation of separate or divisional applications.

Based upon the ruling of the Classification Examiner, and also upon an unpublished Commissioner's Order mentioned in Office Action of April 8, 1936, (see Butler application, Ser. No. 575,011, Div. 18), which governs the practice in Government cases falling in this entegory, it is requested in the present case that the divisional requirement be waived.
