- 1. The UK delegates had not had an opportunity to read carefully the Minutes of the Plenary Session and consideration of this item was postponed. The Minutes of the First Meeting of the Conference were corrected as follows:
 - (a) Delete all reference to the Executive Committee in paragraph 2.
 (b) Substitute for (a) above, the following: "Papers produced by the two subcommittees will be considered by the conference sitting as a committee of the whole."

The minutes were then approved as corrected.

2. The Chairman then placed before the delegates the Report of Subcommittee 1 (FSC 004). This report was considered paragraph by paragraph and minor editorial changes were made. A rather detailed discussion arose concerning paragraphs 9 and 11b. With respect to paragraph 9, Mr. Packard recommended that the following be added to 9(c): "We have not recommended any conclusion that the security of communications of these NATO countries is worth a
