Another Round

The feud between Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy (R., Wis.) and Columnist Drew Pearson sizzled today. Sen. McCarthy claimed the FBI had an "airtight case" of espionage against Mr. Pearson which could send the newspaperman to prison. Mr. Pearson denied the charges as

"absolutely false." Sen. McCarthy, one of several defendants in a slander and anti-trust suit filed by Mr. Pearson, made the charges in a Senate speech late yes terday. He said it was based on investigation of alleged "leaks" of re-

stricted information to Mr. Pearson. The Columnist said in reply to the latest charges Sen. McCarthy, "from the cowardly safety of his Senate immunity, is rehashing a phony four-month-old incident which he knows to be absolutely false."

"Perhaps he is doing so," Mr. Pearson said, "to cover up the fact that he himself violated cryptoinat he himself violated cryptographic security by publishing the exact date of a coded message, thereby helping the enemy to break our secret code."

Army Secretary Frank Pace Jr., said Feb. 10 that the Army's investigation of Sen. McCarthy's earlier charges had produced "negative

"The information I published . was not in violation of the Espionage Act."

Says It Was Cleared.

Senator McCarthy charged in that Mr. Pearson's December column violated military secrecy. Mr. Pearson said the material had been cleared before he used it.

In yesterday's speech Senator McCarthy said the Army and FBI investigations "have produced evidence to make a clear-cut case of violation of the espionage laws by Mr. Pearson," and the information is in the hands of the Justice Department.

Mr. Pearson has brought a damage suit against Senator Mc-Carthy, and others, charging that the Senator attacked him physically at a party last December 12 and, with the others, circulated "libelous, false and defamatory" assertions about him.
