I quote below the text of a memorandum relating to your inquiry of December 2, with respect to a forthcoming publication on the wartime conferences. The source of the information is Mr. G. Bernard Boble, Chief of the Historical Division, Department of State:

- "l. The text of the messages (there were three, I believe) is included in the volumes on the Potsdam Conference.
- "R. The text is quoted from the published proceedings of the Tokyo War Crimes Trials, so the material is in print already.
- "3. There is a footnote which states that the text of these messages was known to' US officials on July 13.
- "h. There is a further footnote reference to the published Forrestal Diaries in which the process of obtaining the material is clearly identified.
- "5. The text further quotes Secretary Stimson writing that he received from the Fentagon an 'interesting message' on July 16.
- "6. The phrasing of the footnote mentioned in 3 above is as agreed with the Pentagon to replace a more explicit statement on the galley-proofs submitted to Defense."
