The next regular meeting of SCAG, which had been scheduled to be held on 5 and 6 March 1952, is to be held instead on 12 and 13 March. The Agenda for the meeting will be sent you in advance thereof.

It would be helpful to all concerned if SCAG members could devote, individually at their own convenience and a day or two in advance of the scheduled meeting, time to reading and studying two important documents which, although not specifically prepared for examination by SCAG, would be highly useful in preparation for detailed discussion of certain problems to be considered at the next meeting.

These documents review in detail the approaches that are being currently taken and planned, and the progress that has been made thus far, with regard to problems of interest to SCAG. They are primarily mathematical in character but certain parts deal with engineering aspects contingent upon the validity of the mathematical studies. It is highly desirable, in particular for those SCAG members whose primary interests are in the mathematical aspects, to review these documents as soon as practicable,

Unfortunately, the documents in question are of such a nature that they cannot be sent you, and will have to be studied either at Arlington Hall Station or at the Navy Security Station.

Would you be good enough to advise if you can find the time for the purpose indicated and if so, when such a visit will be convenient? I may then arrange for travel orders and be prepared to assign comfortable desk space for the day or two of leisurely study.

I would like to add that Dr. Engstrom has indicated his desire to discuss SCAG affairs with you at the time of your visit in advance of the scheduled meeting. Upon receipt of a reply from you, I will notify him when you expect to be here.
