Dear Mr. Hoover:

Reference is made to my letter of 11 June 1954, and to your very gracious reply of 16 June, in connection with the technical assistance given us with your kind permission by Special Agent Fred M. Miller of the technical staff of the FBI Laboratory. In my letter I said that when the manuscript of our book was completed, I would submit to you for your approval that part of it which deals with what Dr. Miller did for us.

Accordingly, I enclose for your scrutiny a copy of two typescript pages of Chapter XII, containing our account of Dr. Miller's assistance; there is no further mention of him or of the Federal Bureau of Investigation anywhere else in the manuscript.
