Possible Compromise of COMMIT Information.

- 1. U.S. Navy VR1 aircraft BUNO 128441 flight 124/30 outbound from U.S. Maval Air Station, Patuxent, Maryland, to Lajes, Azores, crashed between the hours of 0403Z and 1152Z, 31 October 1954.
- 2. This aircraft was carrying 227 pounds of officer courier mail including cleven (il) packages of COMM material. All officer courier material was located in a scaled compartment in the bolly of the aircraft.
- 3. The last report heard from this aircraft was at 170403Z October. Its position at that time was given as 38-06%, 69-12W (above the Atlantic Ccean about 700 miles east of Washington).
- 4. Search and rescue operations were conducted during the periods 31 October - 3 November and 6 - 11 November. The search, said to be the most extensive ever conducted by the Navy, involved some 200 aircruft and 26 surface vessels and covered an area of 7 million square miles.
 - 5. To trace of the wreckage has been found.
- 6. Accountability for the COMMY material aboard this aircraft hus been lost. However, based on the above facts, it does not appear that there is any reasonable basis for a presumption that this material could have found its war into unauthorized hands.
- 7. It is therefore recommended that the above incident be considered as involving no compromise to the COLORT material aboard the aircraft.
- 8. The above facts and recommendation are submitted in accordance with Section V, CIBD #9, dated 4 February 1954.
